Discussion Items

Cr Mather – Welcomed everyone, acknowledged the Councillors and Council officers, and placed apologies for the Mayor, Cr Hutton and Cr Kelly.

Cr Mather provided brief overview on key issues for this locality including:

- Funding from the Defence force to upgrade the Stanage Bay Road, exact expenditure items still to be determined. Encouraged the community to write to council with their list of priorities.
- Seventeen (17) properties have now been sold to the Australia Defence Force, which equates to 30% of the shire now owned by Defence and putting more strain on the ratepayer.
- The matter of a possible future boundary realignment has been referred to the Electoral Commission and nothing will happen prior to the local Government elections in March 2020.

Cr Belot provided update on his portfolio including:

- Working hard to ensure waste and recycling practices are in place for the region, this can be challenging
- Acknowledged and accepted that Councillors' do not get to Stanage or remote areas in general as much as they should but reiterated to the community that you may think we don't care but we do try to govern for the whole shire.

Cr Wyatt provided update on his portfolio including:

- When elected his promise was to make Livingstone Shire Council the Tourism capital of the region and create jobs to keep children staying in our region.
- Council has created fantastic state standard sporting facilities, activated our foreshore and hosted events that have injected wealth into our community.

Cr Eastwood provided update on his portfolio including:

- Portfolio includes Arts, culture, sport, recreation, and youth. Thoroughly enjoys the portfolio as it all links to the community.
- The online world of libraries is amazing and encourages everyone to jump online and check out its services.
