### FILLING of EXTRAORDINARY VACANCY caused by resignation of Cr McRUVIE, July 2003

Cr McRUVIE resigned on Wednesday 2 July 2003 citing differences with the Mayor.

Under the Local government Act, because it was within the last 12 months of a term, a replacement Councillor could be appointed, rather than the need for a by-election.

Council received 23 nominations (nominations closed 5pm Friday 8 August 2003) for the vacancy and in a closed vote at a meeting on Wednesday night 27 August 2003, Council appointed Barry DORSETT (Caves resident, Manager QMAG) to serve the remaining 7 months of Cr McRUVIE's term.

Notable among the nominations were former Councillors John Dowie and Glenda Mather (nominated for Mayor) and future Federal Member for Capricornia, Michelle Landry.

Barry DORSETT (resident of The Caves and Manager of QMAG) was appointed in a closed vote by Council at a Meeting on Wednesday night 27 August 2003, to serve the remaining 7 months of the current term. (source: *The Morning Bulletin*)

Barry DORSETT signed his Declaration of Office on 5 September 2003. Cr DORSETT attended the General Meeting on 24 September 2003 and the Finance & Strategy Committee Meeting on 1<sup>st</sup> October 2003. (source: *Livingstone Shire Council Attendance Book 28 March 2001 to 11 March 2008*)
